Winter Seminar 2018

The traditional winter seminar for Israeli string players, which took place from 12th to 15th December 2018, was the fourth that we have held in collaboration with Polyphony Education from Nazareth, in the same format as previous seminars. Seventy students participated in the seminar, (of them 19 Arab and 51 Jewish students), which included personal instruction under the guidance of prominent string musicians from Israel and from abroad; playing in guided chamber music ensembles and in a large combined ensemble of all the participants.



A social get-together on the first evening broke the ice and was enjoyed by all.



Enrichment activities included, among other things, a masterclass led by **Chaim Taub** which has become a tradition at the seminar. This time Taub gave his masterclass to one of the chamber ensembles.

The results of the seminar were presented to the families and to the general public at the final concert on Saturday 15th December at the Bar-Uryan Hall.





Soloists at the concert were rewarded with applause, among them **Shany Levi** (right) from Migdal Haemek, the pupil of Mila Feldman, who performed concerto for violin No.1 Op. 6, and **Sophie Rochlin** from Ashdod, the student of Lena Mazor, who played the waltz-scherzo Op. 34 by Tchaikovsky.

The work of the chamber ensembles produced two pieces which were performed at the final concert as well.

One ensemble, under the direction of **Shlomo Tintpulver** performed a movement from the String Quartet in G major by Haydn.

After two years of fundraising to bring the initiative to fruition, renowned chamber musicians, who are friends of Angela and Vadim – pianist **Alessio Bax**, double bass player **Niek de Groot**, cellist **Johannes Moser** and violist **Tabea Zimmermann** – gathered at the Keshet Eilon campus and "made music" with the participation of the audience.

- Efforts are being made to speed up receipt of the permits that are required to begin construction on stage 2. At the same time, plans are being completed with the contractors.
- To further the realization of our vision for the music school and its program, we are continuing to gather information relating to the management of similar music academies in other countries. These efforts are being coordinated by our representative, Hadass Zohar, a native of Kibbutz Bar'm, who now lives in the United States.
- At the same time we are engaged in our ceaseless efforts to raise funds for the construction of the Academy. In this connection, Gilad Sheba and Nitza Avidan made a short trip to Geneva in order to renew our request for funds from old friends of Keshet Eilon in that city.


The Trout Quintet – As described above, the MMF ISRAEL chamber ensemble presented an inspired performance of Schubert's Trout Quintet.


News of the Friends of Keshet Eilon committees around the world

The 2019 International String Mastercourse at Keshet Eilon

Registration for the summer course closed on 28.2.19. Detailed information about the faculty members of the course can be found at the Keshet Eilon website: www.keshetei.org.il

The central topics that will be in focus this summer:

- The on-going conflict between the desire to develop the talent of youngsters defined as prodigies, and at the same time-preserve the regular routine of their lives. We will study the teaching methods of **Leopold Mozart** according to which he raised his own talented children **Nannerl** and **Wolfgang Amadeus** and also examine the method of "tiger parenting" in the education of gifted young musicians.
- We will make acquaintance with **Leopold Mozart's** most important treatise which he wrote 300 years ago, which deals with the basic principles of violin playing and influences violin playing up to the present day.
- The art of writing cadenzas for concerts, which we will study at a special workshop under the guidance of Noam
 Sivan pianist, composer, arranger, conductor and multidisciplinary artist, professor at the Julliard School of Music and at the Curtis Institute
